## Our Mission

We cannot celebrate a faith we do not practice. We cannot proclaim a gospel we do not live. Our mission statement allows us to proclaim our commitment to charity and justice and through the delivery of our services to make Christ visible in our community.

## Our Value and Mandate

Our value statement mandates the challenge of our Lord Jesus Christ, when he encouraged us in the Sermon on the Mount to explore what it means to be "poor in spirit" in a consumer society; to comfort those who suffer in our midst; to "show mercy" in an often unforgiving world; "to hunger and thirst for justice" in a nation still challenged by hunger and homelessness, poverty and prejudice; to be "peacemakers" in an often violent and fearful world; and as Catholic to be the light of the world to all His children.

## Our Ministry

Incorporated in 1931, Catholic Charities remains for the residents of Miami-Dade, Broward and Monroe Counties a pioneer in social service provision. As a leader in the field of providing specialized programs, outcome oriented results and social advocacy, Catholic Charities has remained faithful to the Gospel messages which call us to work for justice and mercy in the world. Our ministry makes Christ present in the local and international community to all who require His love and compassion.

# Serving the Community

Our Catholic Charities ministry offers us a unique opportunity to take up the challenge of the poor and vulnerable with a new urgency and energy. It allows us to deepen the roots of our Catholic Social Teachings and to broaden our collaborative participation with other faith-based organizations, private and public partners as we work in solidarity as one human family.

**Elderly** – Enhancing human life and dignity is the cornerstone of our tradition and

nowhere is that more evident than in the



services provided to the elderly. Services are geared towards assisting the elderly to remain in their communities and homes, thus preventing premature institutionalization. Supervised activities range from music, art, exercise, wellness, health assessments, congregate meals, social activities and fieldtrips.

**Childcare** – As the most vulnerable of God's creation, how children fare is the basic moral test of our society. To this end our child care and development programs are dedicated to providing the highest level of early childhood education in a multicultural, inclusive, learning environment where each child is respected and viewed as a capable and contributing member of our community.



**Refugees** – People have a fundamental right to life and to those things that make life truly human; freedom of conscience, religious liberty, to immigrate, to live free of

discrimination, and to have a share of earthly goods sufficient for

one's self and family. Refugees are served through a variety of services; resettlement, acculturation, legal, employment, case management, medical, mental health, foster care, emergency housing and cash assistance.



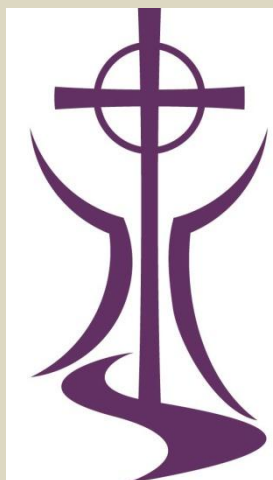
# Serving the Community

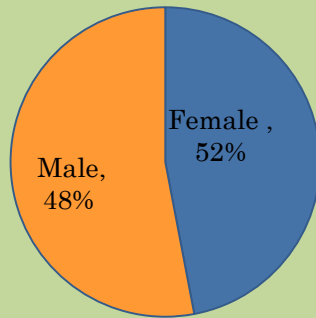

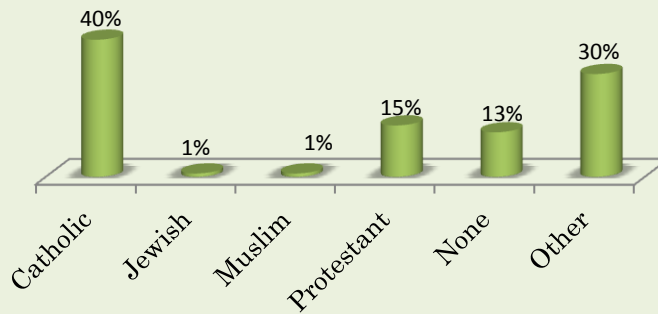

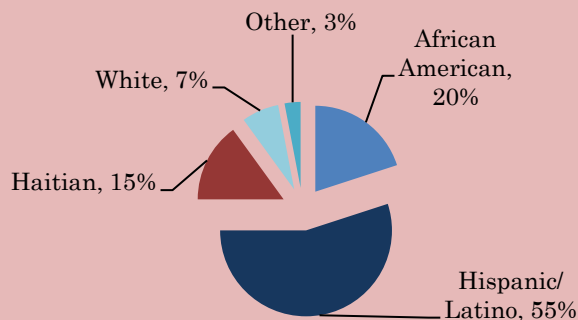
## Gender of Consumers Served



## Religion of Consumers Served

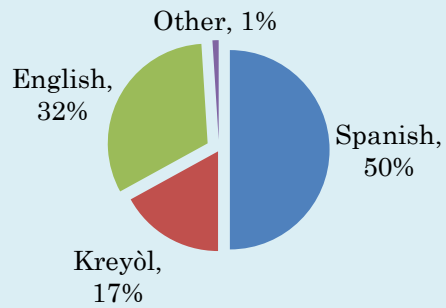


## Race of Consumers Served

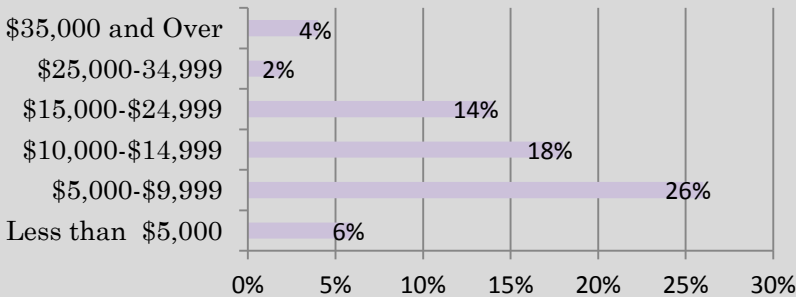

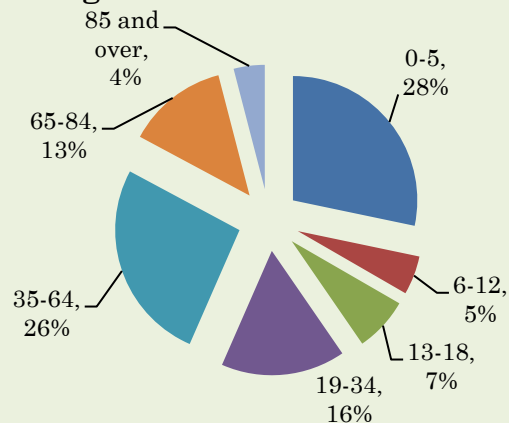
**Primary Language of Consumers Served**



**Household Income of Consumers Served**



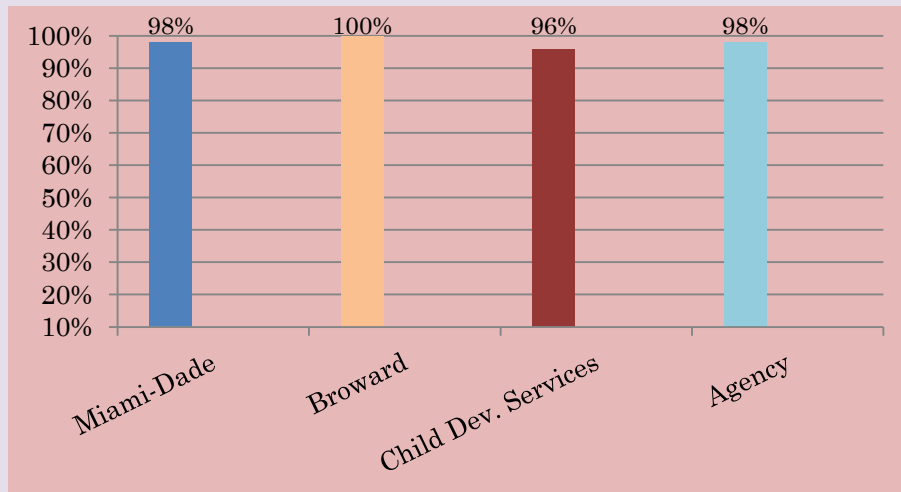
**Age of Consumers Served**



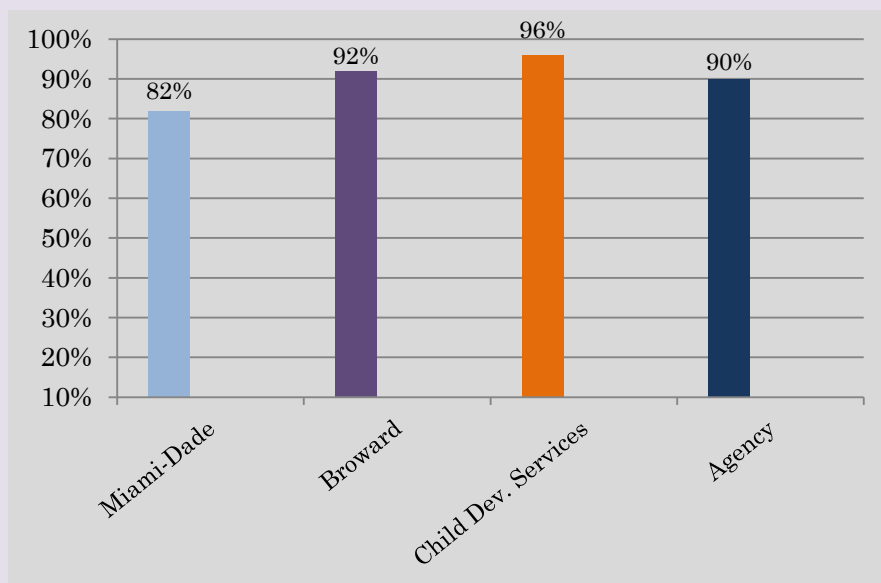


# Consumer Satisfaction Survey Results
